1. CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Eastvale City Council was called to order on March 8, 2017, at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Tessari.

INVOCATION

Pastor Dennis Morales of Calvary Chapel Eastvale offered the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Council Member Plott led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance to our Flag.

3. PRESENTATIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

3.1 Legislative Update by Erin Sasse, Regional Public Affairs Manager, League of California Cities

Erin Sasse, Regional Public Affairs Manager, provided a legislative update to the City Council and answered related questions.

4. STUDENT LIAISON REPORT

Natalie Diaz, Student Liaison, was not present for the meeting.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT

Mayor Tessari opened the Public Comments portion of the meeting

Justin Dewaele, Field Representative for Assemblywoman Sabrina Cervantes' office, introduced himself to the City Council and provided a brief update on the office.

Kathy Johnson, Eastvale resident, encouraged the Council to follow Senate Bill 54 and the impacts the proposed bill would have on local communities.

Wade Hsu, Eastvale resident, spoke on behalf of the Eastvale Swim Club and sought assistance from the Council on the use of pools at public schools. Council Member Rush encouraged Mr. Hsu to speak with Bill Newberry, the City's Corona-Norco Unified School District Board representative.

Mayor Tessari closed the Public Comments portion of the meeting.

6. CONSENT CALENDAR

6.1 Waive Reading of Ordinances and Resolutions

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Council Member Rigby, the Council voted unanimously by those present to waive the reading of the text of all standard ordinances and resolutions included in the agenda except as specifically required by the Government Code.

6.2 City Council Meeting Minutes

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Council Member Rigby, the Council voted to approve the minutes from the regular meeting held on March 8, 2017.

6.3 Warrant Register

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Council Member Rigby, the Council voted unanimously to Approve the Payment of Warrants as Submitted by the Finance Department.

6.4 Eastvale Connection

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Council Member Rigby, the Council voted unanimously to receive and file the Eastvale Connection.

6.5 Public Information Officer Monthly Summary

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Council Member Rigby, the Council voted unanimously to receive and file Public Information Officer Monthly Summary.

6.6 Planning Department Update

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Council Member Rigby, the Council voted unanimously to receive and file the Planning Department update.

6.7 Public Works Department Update

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Council Member Rigby, the Council voted unanimously to receive and file the Public Works Department Update.

6.8 Shopping Cart Retrieval Ordinance – Second Reading

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Council Member Rigby, the Council voted unanimously to Approve the Second Reading of Ordinance No. 2017-01 Adding Chapter 6.78 of Title 6 Entitled “Shopping Carts” to the Eastvale Municipal Code.

7. PUBLIC HEARINGS

8. CITY COUNCIL BUSINESS

8.1 Quarterly Grants Update

Interim Finance Director James Riley presented the staff report and answered related questions.

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Mayor Tessari, the Council voted unanimously to receive and file the Quarterly Grants Update.

8.2 Roadway Adoption Program Revisions

WRCOG Fellow Christine Jamoralin presented the staff report and answered related questions.

Council Member Rigby inquired on revising the recommended changes to a 3:1 adult to child ratio as he did not feel comfortable with a 5:1 to ratio.

On motion of Council Member Rigby and second by Council Member Rush, the Council voted unanimously to Approve Changes to the Roadway Adoption Program Policy and amend the ratio to reflect 3:1 instead of 5:1.

8.3 Additional Programs Offered by Waste Management Update

Senior Administrative Analyst Rodriguez presented the staff report and answered related questions. She indicated that the community survey favored the At-Your-Door program.

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Mayor Tessari, the Council voted unanimously to direct staff to transition to the At-Your-Door program from the Recycle Bank program.

8.4 Revise Salary Schedule to Reinstate Two Former Classifications, Management Analyst and Senior Accountant, and to add a New Classification of Intern; to Reclassify Two Employees; and to Add a New Authorized Position of Intern

City Manager Nissen presented the staff report and answered related questions

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Mayor Tessari, the Council voted unanimously to approve the following changes to personnel:

1. Approve Reinstatement of Previous Job Classifications and Revised Job Descriptions for: Management Analyst and Senior Accountant at "Range 12"
2. Approve Two New Intern Job Classification at Range "0"
3. Approve Resolution Including Salary Schedule
4. Approve Resolution Amending List of Authorized Positions

8.5 BEYOND Framework Fund Grant Opportunity – Western Riverside Council of Governments

City Manager Nissen presented the staff report and answered related questions.

On motion of Council Member Rush and second by Mayor Tessari, the Council voted unanimously to focus the BEYOND grant funding on Option 1. Build shade covers over the RTA bus stops in Eastvale where applicable.

8.6 Regional Streetlight Acquisition Program – Western Riverside Council of Governments

City Manager Nissen presented the staff report and answered related questions.

There was lengthy discussion on the outcome of the Jurupa Community Services District Board of Directors meeting and clarification on the motions taken at the meeting.

Council Member Rigby stated that moving forward with any future developments he would like to see all the streetlights and Lighting Maintenance Districts (LMDs) be held by the City of Eastvale. City Manager Nissen stated that staff is also proposing that the Landscape Lighting Districts (LLDs) be held as well.

City Attorney Cavanaugh stated that for the record he would like a consensus from the City Council that this is how it wishes to proceed. It was at the consensus of the City Council that for any future developments all streetlights, LMDs, and LLDs be held by the City.

It was the consensus of the City Council to receive and file the report.

9. CITY MANAGER/CITY STAFF REPORT

City Manager Nissen commended WRCOG Fellow Christine Jamoralin on her fellowship with the City of Eastvale. She noted her accomplishments while assigned to the City. Mayor Pro Tem Lorimore requested to recognize Christine at a future Council meeting.

City Engineer Indrawan provided an update on the sinkhole repair on Hamner Avenue in front of Swan Lake.

Senior Administrative Analyst Rodriguez provided an update on Eastvale events and reminded the City Council of the upcoming State of the City on Tuesday, April 4 as well as the Chandler Fire Station #31 Grand Opening on Wednesday, April 19.

10. CITY COUNCIL COMMUNICATIONS/COMMITTEE REPORTS

Council Member Rush spoke on the 91 Express Lanes opening and the 15 Freeway and Interstate 71 project. He also asked about a speed trailer by Harada Elementary and encouraged the public to attend the Coffee with a Cop event.

Council Member Rush concluded his comments on asking staff to look into the possibility of expanding the roadway between 58th and Swan Lake.

Council Member Rigby inquired on the cost of a speed trailer and City Engineer Indrawan stated the rough cost was \$9,000. He requested that staff look into purchasing another speed trailer. He provided an update on the Short-Term Tenancy Ad-Hoc Committee and stated the first meeting will be on Wednesday, April 5. Council Member Rigby concluded his comments on requesting information on an ordinance that would regulate businesses from being open 24 hours.

Council Member Plott stated he would be attending a judging for a Gold Ribbon Award at River Heights Intermediate tomorrow evening.

10.1 League of California Cities

Mayor Pro Tem Lorimore stated that the League hosted its division meeting in Indian Wells on Monday, March 13. He stated that the Division spoke on AB199 (oppose), SB540 - Roth (support), and AB91 – Cervantes (tabled).

On Tuesday, March 28, the League of California Cities Riverside Division will be having a Legislative Committee meeting to discuss upcoming bills.

Mayor Pro Tem Lorimore stated that the Transportation, Communication, and Public Works Committee would be meeting on Friday, March 30, in the City of Ontario.

10.2 Southern California Association of Governments

Mayor Pro Tem Lorimore stated that he attended a SCAG Legislative Advocacy Trip on March 14 and 15 to meet with legislators and discuss transportation, affordability of housing, cap and trade funding, and support of SB37.

10.3 Western Riverside County of Governments

Council Member Rush stated that WRCOG had a homeless issue on the agenda and it was brought before by the City of Banning to take a regional approach on homelessness. He stated that the City of Riverside is requesting support for a BEYOND grant to tackle the issue of homelessness.

10.4 Riverside Transit Agency

Council Member Plott stated that he attended the RTA's 40th Anniversary Celebration on Thursday, March 16, and stated it was a great turnout.

10.5 Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District

Mayor Tessari provided an update on the Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District Board of Directors meeting. He stated that the Board was provided with an update on the West Nile Virus and Zika Virus.

10.6 Riverside County Transportation Commission

There was no update provided.

10.7 Western Riverside County Regional Conservation Agency


There was no update provided.
