Part 1 Crimes decreased by 25.5% from 47 to 35 over the past two weeks in the city of Eastvale.

Property Crimes decreased by 13.9% from 36 to 31.

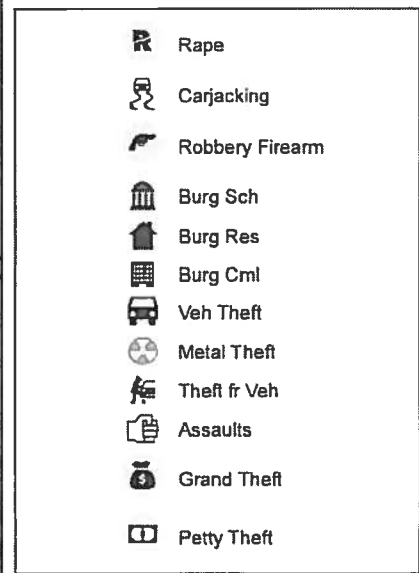
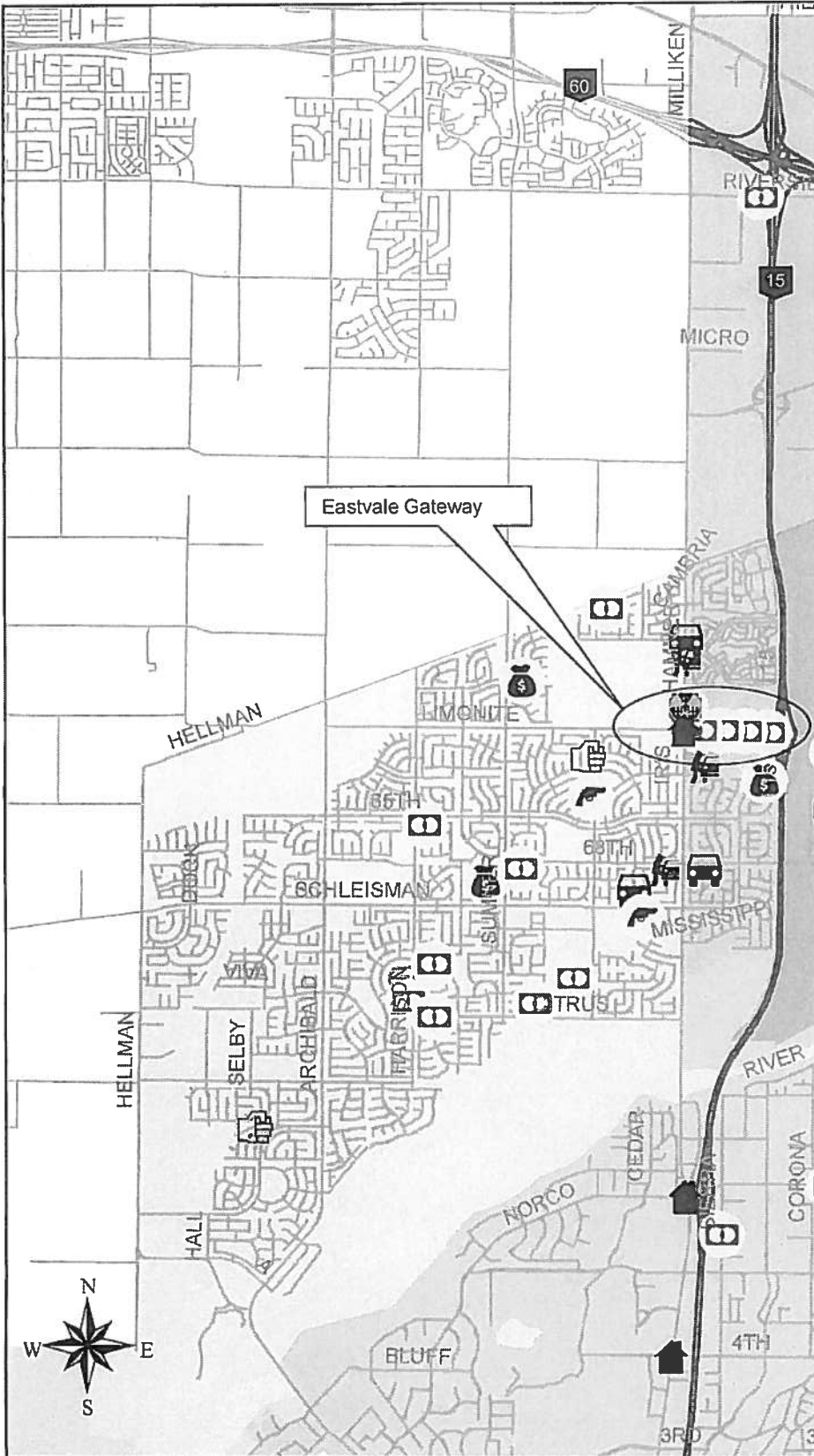

Property Crimes decreased by 18.6% from 43 to 35.

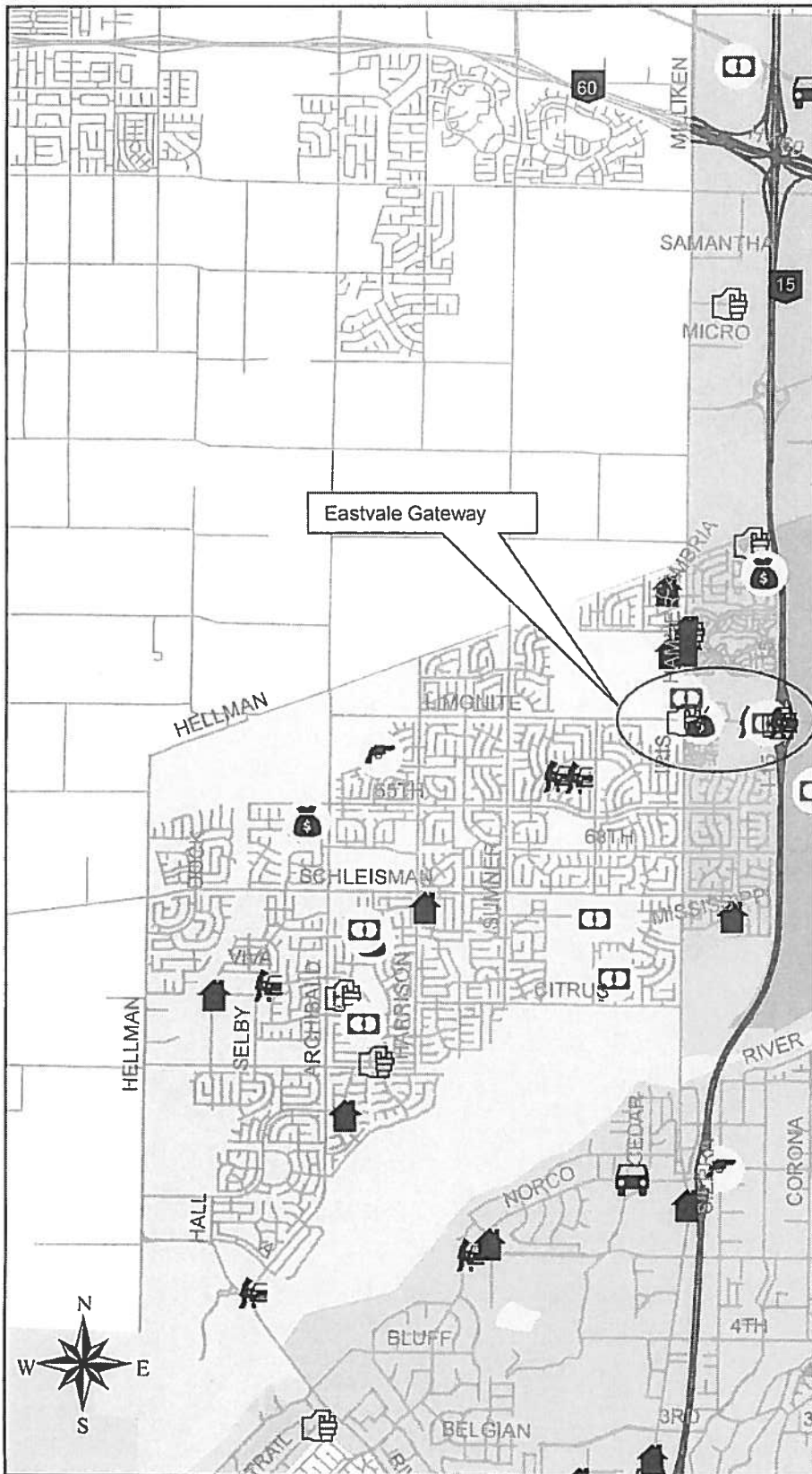

SUBJECT: Bicyclist's Hit by Vehicle

REQUESTED ACTION:

Receive and file

BACKGROUND:

Approximately two weeks ago a 13 year old boy riding his bicycle was struck by a vehicle at the intersection of Alderwood and Walnut Grove. The four legged intersection is controlled by stop signs on Walnut Grove. A search of our accident records found no previous accidents have been reported at this intersection. As the bicycle rider entered the intersection, traveling southbound on Alderwood, he failed to stop and was struck by a vehicle traveling 25-30 MPH just before the impact. The impact caused the rider to be vaulted onto the car breaking the grill and windshield.

The bicycle rider admitted to not stopping for the stop sign at the intersection. Fortunately, the young rider only sustained minor injuries. Following the accident, Public Works Staff to the site of the accident and found nothing that could have contributed to the accident. We will follow up with any requests that we receive and inform the Public Safety Commission of our findings and recommendation

SUBJECT: Hellman Avenue Improvements

REQUESTED ACTION: Receive and file

BACKGROUND:

This is an update for the Hellman Avenue improvements between River Rd and approximately 1500 feet north of the bridge which is north of Chandler Ave. Last month a meeting was held with the City of Chino and representatives of the Lewis Properties. At that meeting Lewis agreed to improve Hellman Ave from Chino/Corona Rd to 1500 feet north of the bridge at their costs. The improvement will consist of grinding the existing pavement followed by an overlay of new asphalt. Construction will begin in November 2012.

Also, in September 2012 a meeting was held with Lennar Properties to discuss the improvements on Hellman Ave south of Chandler Ave. Lennar is in the process of purchasing the property south of Chandler Ave and east of Hellman Ave. As a condition of approval, the developer is required to widen and improve Chandler and Hellman Avenues along their frontage. One of the conditions is to install a storm drain on Hellman Ave from Chandler Ave to about 3,500 feet south. Following the storm drain construction, Hellman Ave will be resurfaced from Chandler to about 3,500 south. This will leave only about 850 feet to be improved to River Rd. Public Works is recommending that the City enter into a cooperative agreement with Lennar to repave the remaining 850 feet. The costs for this portion would be shared equally between the Cities of Chino and Eastvale. If the purchase is successful, Lennar will improve Hellman Ave the summer of 2013. Staff will provide updates as they become available.

DISCUSSION:

On October 9, 2012 the Assistant City Clerk met with the County of Riverside Office of Emergency Services representatives and the City of Jurupa Valley in regards to Local Hazard Mitigation Planning.

The County of Riverside completely revamped their Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) and had it certified by the State of California and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). From their plan, they have created a template that each City can use to create their own LHMP. The City of Lake Elsinore has successfully used the template. Staff was provided with login information to the County's website to download the County LHMP, as well as the template and resource information.

Staff has begun to research information necessary to develop Eastvale's LHMP. Sections of the LHMP will be coming to the Public Safety Commission for review, in a similar manner that the Emergency Operations Plan was presented. It is essential that the City submit the LHMP and have it certified. By doing so, the City will not only be more prepared for an emergency, but will also be eligible for mitigation grants and recovery funds.

ORDINANCE NO. 2011-03

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EASTVALE,
CALIFORNIA, ADDING CHAPTER 2.18 OF TITLE 2 OF THE CITY OF EASTVALE
MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO THE PUBLIC SAFETY COMMISSION.**

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EASTVALE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1. Chapter 2.18 Public Safety Commission, as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby added to Title 2 of the City of Eastvale Municipal Code.

Section 2. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, sentences, clauses, phrases or portions thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 3. Upon the effective date of this Ordinance, the provisions hereof shall supersede any conflicting provisions of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Riverside as the same were adopted by City Ordinance No. 2010-01.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall certify the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be posted as required by law.

EXHIBIT "A"

CHAPTER 2.18 – PUBLIC SAFETY COMMISSION

2.18.010. Public Safety Commission Established.

A Public Safety Commission which shall be known as the Public Safety Commission of the City of Eastvale is hereby created and established.

2.18.020. General Provisions.

A. Membership.

The Commission shall consist of five members who shall be registered voters of the City. Members shall not be officers or employees of the City. All members serve at the will and pleasure of the City Council. A Public Safety Commissioner may be removed at any time during a term of office by an affirmative vote of three (3) Councilmembers.

B. Terms of office–Vacancy.

(a) Each City Councilmember shall propose to the City Council in the form of a nomination of one (1) City resident to serve on the Public Safety Commission. Unless there is a four-fifths vote taken against a nomination, each nominee shall be automatically appointed to the Public Safety Commission. Appointments shall be made at a regular City Council meeting.

(b) Each Public Safety Commissioner shall serve a term of two (2) years. Each term shall coincide with the City's regular general election date. The first Public Safety Commissioners appointed shall serve until the first Public Safety Commission meeting after the election results of the first general municipal election is certified.

(c) If a vacancy occurs otherwise than by expiration of a term, it shall be filled by appointment for the unexpired portion of the term by the individual Councilmember who made the appointment to the seat which is vacant.

C. Absence from Meetings.

Any Commission member absent from two (2) consecutive regularly scheduled meetings, or absent from three (3) regularly scheduled meetings of the Commission during a calendar year, may be removed from office. By an affirmative vote of three (3) Councilmembers, the City Council may declare a vacancy on the Public Safety Commission and direct the City Clerk to post the notice of vacancy and begin the application process to fill the unexpired term.

2.18.030. Officers; meetings; rules and regulations; records.

The Public Safety Commission shall elect its chairman from among its appointed members for a term of one year, and shall likewise elect one of its members to serve as presiding officer pro tempore (vice-chairman) at the pleasure of the Commission. The Public Safety Commission shall hold at least one meeting quarterly but not more than 3 meetings quarterly in the City Council chambers which shall be open to the public, and may adjourn or readjourn any regular meeting to a date and hour certain which shall be specified in the order of adjournment. When so adjourned, such adjourned meeting shall be a regular meeting for all purposes. If at any time any regular meeting falls on a holiday, such regular meeting shall be held in the next business day. The Public Safety Commission shall adopt rules and regulations for transaction of business and shall keep a record of its resolutions, transactions, findings and determinations, which records shall be a public record.

2.18.040. Duties.

The Public Safety Commission shall be charged with the responsibility for making recommendations regarding matters affecting

1. Public Perceptions of effectiveness of
2. Crime Incidences
3. Crime trends
4. Life Safety issues/Neighborhood Watch
5. Fire Prevention/ Awareness
6. Emergency Preparedness
7. Public safety/Traffic calming measures such as stop signs and yield signs
8. Other matters that may be directed by order of the City Council.

2.18.050 Power and authority.

The Public Safety Commission shall cause proper records to be kept of all its official acts and proceedings. The Commission shall have no power or authority to bind or obligate the City or any officer or department thereof for any money, debt, undertaking or obligation of any kind in excess of the appropriation which the City Council may have made for the purpose of the Commission in any fiscal year.

2.18.060. Rules of organization and procedure.

The Commission is a reviewing and recommending body only and shall have no power to direct members of the city staff or contract entities. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter or by

law, the Commission shall have power to and shall provide for its own organization, shall adopt rules and regulations for the transaction of business before it, and shall designate the time and place for the regular monthly meeting or meetings of the Commission.

2.18.070. Stipend.

Members of the Public Safety Commission may receive a stipend for their services as set by resolution of the City Council. No additional monies shall be paid for expenses incurred by the members of the commission in the performance of their duties, except that the City Council may from time to time authorize in advance, expenditures for attendance at seminars, institutes, or other meetings which the City Council finds to be beneficial to the commissioners in the performance of their duties, and in the best interest of the city. Claims for such expenses shall be filed with the finance director, or designee, and shall be subject to audit and approval by the City Council.
