Consistent with the Governor's Executive Order No. N-29-20 and the City of Eastvale's declaration of a local emergency, the Planning Commission meeting will not be physically open to the public. To maximize public safety while still maintaining transparency and public access, members of the public can observe the meeting by **GoTo Webinar platform** and may provide public comment by sending comments to the City Clerk's Office by email at cityclerk@eastvaleca.gov. Staff will monitor emails to the extent possible during the meeting and provide comments as possible. All comments will be made part of the record. Comments will then be read into the record, with a maximum allowance of 3 minutes per individual comment, subject to the Chair's discretion to reduce time on public comment. All comments should be a maximum of 500 words, which corresponds to approximately 3 minutes of speaking time. If a comment is received after the agenda item is heard but before the close of the meeting, the comment will still be included as a part of the record of the meeting but will not be read into the record.
