#### ORDINANCE NO. 2013-17

#### AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EASTVALE MAKING FINDINGS AND AMENDING CHAPTER 5, SECTION 5.7E OF THE EASTVALE ZONING CODE, REGULATING TEMPORARY SIGNS IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY

WHEREAS, upon its incorporation in 2010, the City of Eastvale ("City") adopted the Riverside County Zoning Code and County Ordinance 806, which regulated temporary signs; and

WHEREAS, subsequently in July 2012, the City Council adopted a comprehensive update to the City's Zoning Code to (i) reflect the goals, policies, and implementation measures of the City's first General Plan; (ii) ensure compliance with applicable federal and state legislation; (iii) address the City's key zoning issues; (iv) create development standards reflective of community desires; and (v) improve organization of usability of the Zoning Code; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of the updated Zoning Code included the repeal of County Ordinances 348 and 806 but continued with the prohibition of temporary signs in the public right of way; and

WHEREAS, the business community continues to express the need for signs in the public right of way in order to foster a more vibrant economy in Eastvale; and

WHEREAS, the City Council directed staff to amend the regulations for temporary signs in the public right of way so that these signs can be placed subject to regulations regarding time, place, and manner of display as authorized under state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, City staff presented draft amended regulations for temporary signs in the public right of way to the Planning Commission for review and recommendation; and

WHEREAS, on November 18, 2013, the Planning Commission held a lawfully noticed public hearing on the proposed draft amended regulations for Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way wherein the Planning Commission received public testimony; and

WHEREAS, after considering all public testimony, the Planning Commission recommended approval to the City Council of the proposed draft Regulations for Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way; and

WHEREAS, upon receiving the Planning Commission's recommendation of approval for the proposed draft amended Regulations for Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way, the City Council held a lawfully noticed public hearing on December 11, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the proposed amended Regulations for Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way are consistent with the City's General Plan because the regulations are compatible with applicable General Plan goals and policies, and do not impede achievement of the goals, policies, and actions; and WHEREAS, the City is authorized to adopt reasonable time, place and manner Regulations for Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way pursuant to its "police power" granted by the California Constitution in order to establish appropriate land uses and development standards for the efficient, orderly, and compatible development of real property and to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the City of Eastvale.

# NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EASTVALE DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

#### **SECTION 1.** Environmental Findings

Pursuant to CEQA, and in light of the whole record before it, including but not limited to the City's local CEQA Guidelines and Thresholds of Significance, the proposed Categorical Exemption incorporated therein by reference, any written comments received and responses provided, and other substantial evidence (within the meaning of Public Resources Code Sections 21080(e) and 21082.2) within the record and/or provided at the public hearing, the City Council hereby finds and determines as follows:

<u>Finding</u>: The proposed project is found to be exempt from environmental review pursuant to Section 15061(b3) of the Guidelines for Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Section 15061(b3) states that a project under CEQA must have potential for resulting in a direct physical change in the environment or a reasonably foreseeable indirect change in the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant impact on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA.

<u>Evidence</u>: The proposed amendment to the Eastvale Zoning Code for Regulations for Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way defines regulations for temporary signs in the public right of way, allowing these signs to be legally placed during specified times on weekends. The proposed amendment would not result in any changes in land use or density and none of the changes will create a new parcel.

#### **SECTION 2.** Zoning Code Amendment

Pursuant to Section 1.7 E of the City of Eastvale Zoning Code, the City Council makes the finding below pertaining to an amendment to the Eastvale Zoning Code for Regulations for Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way:

<u>Finding 1</u>: The City Council finds that the changes are consistent with the General Plan goals, policies, and implementation programs.

<u>Evidence</u>: The proposed amendment to the Eastvale Zoning Code for Regulations for Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way is consistent with the City's General Plan because the new regulations are compatible with applicable General Plan goals and policies, and do not impede achievement of the goals, policies, and actions. The proposed Regulations for Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way defines regulations for temporary signs in the public right of way,

allowing these signs to be legally placed during specified times on weekends. The amendment will not change or impact the primary use of the property and is, therefore, consistent with the General Plan because they do not change the zoning or land use designations or permitted uses of any properties.

<u>Finding 2</u>: If the amendment affects land within the Chino Airport Influence Area, the City Council must make an additional finding that the amendment is consistent with the most recent adopted version of the Chino Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan.

<u>Evidence</u>: The Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan shows that the northwestern portion of the city is located in Zones C, D, and E. These zones prohibit high noise-sensitive outdoor nonresidential uses, discourage schools, hospitals, and nursing homes, and require airspace review for structures taller than 70 feet. The proposed amendment does not involve development of prohibited or discouraged uses in Zones C, D, and E. For this reason, the proposed amendment does not require review by the Airport Land Use Commission and is consistent with the policies of the City of Eastvale General Plan and the Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan.

**SECTION 3.** The City Council hereby amends in its entirety Section 5.7 E of Chapter 5 of the Eastvale Zoning Code attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference as Exhibit "A'.

**SECTION 4.** Severability

If any section, subsection, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision and, to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are severable. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance irrespective of the invalidity of any particular portion thereof and intends that the invalid portions should be severed and the balance of the Ordinance be enforced.

**SECTION 5.** Effective Date: This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the date of its adoption.



#### Exhibit "A"

#### "Section 5.E. Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way

- 1. Temporary signs may be placed in the public right of way during the period beginning 4 p.m. Friday and ending 7 p.m. Sunday. Signs in place outside this period will be subject to removal.
- 2. Temporary Sign Size, Materials, and Maintenance Criteria. All temporary signs placed in the right of way must:
  - a) Be free-standing and securely mounted on a wooden or metal stakes;
  - b) Be no higher than four (4) feet above grade;
  - c) Be no larger than six (6) square feet and no more than three (3) feet in either height or width;
  - d) Be constructed of substantial sturdy, durable and weather-proof material;
  - e) Be kept in good repair;
  - f) Be non-illuminated;
  - g) Include the contact name and phone number of the person responsible for the sign in a clearly legible manner, either on the front or back of the sign; and
  - h) Be located in a permitted location as defined in this Section 5.E. 3.
- 3. Sign Location. Temporary signs in the public right of way must be located at least 20 feet from the curved portion of the corner in order to maintain visibility for motorists, as shown in the illustration. In addition, the following apply:
  - a) Signs must be located at least two feet from the edge of a curb or sidewalk, or from the edge of the pavement if there is no curb or sidewalk.
  - b) Signs shall be installed so as not to damage plant materials, irrigation equipment or other public property.
  - c) Signs may not be placed on a sidewalk.
  - d) Signs may not be placed in a roadway median.
  - e) Signs may not be attached to utility poles, sign posts, fences, walls, or any other structure.



4. Temporary Sign - Definition. For purposes of this Section, temporary sign shall mean any sign, including commercial, non-commercial or political sign displayed for a limited period of time.
