8. OLD BUSINESS

8.1 Reorganization & Compensation (Presented in two staff reports)

RECOMMENDATION:

- 1. It is recommended that the City Council approve the proposed reorganization; Further, that the City Manager is authorized to reclassify the Public Information Officer to Assistant City Manager and Account Clerk to Senior Account Clerk. The part-time Code Enforcement Technician to be a closed recruitment; The recruitment for the Senior Administrative Analyst, Administrative Analyst II and the Administrative Analyst I will be an open recruitment.
- 2. Adopt a resolution authorizing a 6.4% increase for all employees, except the City Manager; the cafeteria stipend be increased by \$100/month for all employees and that a 5% increase be authorized for bi-lingual abilities; administrative leave for management employees in the amount of 80 hours/annually; to be effective on December 13, 2014, entitled:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EASTVALE, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING THE AUTHORIZED POSITIONS AND A SALARY SCHEDULE FOR THE 2014-15 FISCAL YEAR, EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 13, 2014

Acting City Manager Van Nort summarized the reorganization staff report.

Councilmembers discussed the item and staff answered related questions.

Motion: Moved by Mayor Pro Tem Link, seconded by Councilmember Tessari to approve recommended action #1.

Motion carried 4-0 with Councilmembers Lorimore, Tessari, Mayor Pro Tem Link and Mayor Bootsma voting aye and Councilmember Rush absent.

Acting City Manager Van Nort summarized the compensation staff report.

Councilmembers discussed the item and staff answered related questions.

Motion: Moved by Mayor Pro Tem Link, seconded by Councilmember Tessari to approve recommended action #2.

Motion carried 3-1 with Councilmember Tessari, Mayor Pro Tem Link and Mayor Bootsma voting aye, Councilmember Lorimore voting no, and Councilmember Rush absent.

9. NEW BUSINESS ITEMS

9.1 Chandler Street Corridor Area Improvements, Project Numbers: 91001 & 91003 & 91004

RECOMMENDATION:

- 1. Approve a contract with Hardy & Harper, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with unit bid prices in the estimated amount of \$244,000.00 for the Chandler Street Corridor projects.
- 2. Approve a funding analysis with a total estimated construction amount of \$307,000.00.

City Engineer Alvarez summarized the staff report.

Councilmembers discussed the item and staff answered related questions.

Motion: Moved by Mayor Pro Tem Link, seconded by Councilmember Lorimore to approve the recommended action.

Motion carried 4-0 with Councilmembers Lorimore, Tessari, Mayor Pro Tem Link and Mayor Bootsma voting aye and Councilmember Rush absent.

9.2 Mayor's Cup Soccer Challenge

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Authorize staff to assist in the recruitment and formation of an Eastvale adult soccer team to represent the City in the Mayor's Cup Soccer Challenge.

Mayor Bootsma requested to pull the item off the agenda due to limited time and resources to participate in the event.

Motion: Moved by Mayor Bootsma, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Link to pull the item off the agenda.

Motion carried 4-0 with Councilmembers Lorimore, Tessari, Mayor Pro Tem Link and Mayor Bootsma voting aye and Councilmember Rush absent.

RECOMMENDATION: Receive and file with informal presentation.

Assistant Planning Director Perring summarized the staff report and presented a PowerPoint presentation.

Councilmembers discussed the item and staff answered related questions.

10. PUBLIC HEARINGS

10.1 Project No. 13-0632 – General Plan Amendment and Change of Zone of an approximately 10-acre Site from Commercial Retail to High Density Residential

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Planning Commission voted 3-2 on September 17, 2014, to recommend that the City Council:

- 1. Deny a General Plan Amendment from Commercial Retail (CR) to High Density Residential (HDR).
- 2. Deny a Change of Zone from Heavy Agriculture (A-2) to General Residential (R-3).

Planning Director Norris stated that the applicant of the project requested that the public hearing be continued to the January 14, 2014 City Council meeting so that the entire City Council could be involved.

Mayor Bootsma opened the public hearing.

Motion: Moved by Councilmember Lorimore, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Link to continue the public hearing to the January 14, 2015 City Council meeting.

Motion carried 4-0 with Councilmembers Lorimore, Tessari, Mayor Pro Tem Link and Mayor Bootsma voting aye and Councilmember Rush absent.

The public hearing was continued to the January 14, 2015 City Council meeting.

Councilmember Tessari discussed the Bicycle Master Plan and staff answered related questions.

Councilmember Lorimore discussed the tree lighting ceremony and the swearing in ceremony of JCSD's new president.

Mayor Pro Tem Link stated that he recently attended a meeting with the Catholic Archdiocese to discuss the construction of a Catholic Church in the City of Eastvale.

Mayor Bootsma welcomed Councilmember Lorimore to the City Council. He announced that sand will be available to the public at the old Al's Corner lot.

Mayor Bootsma discussed the letters being sent to Congressman Calvert's office and staff answered related questions.

Mayor Bootsma announced the tree lighting ceremony at the Eastvale Gateway Center on December 11, 2014.
