9. CITY COUNCIL BUSINESS

9.1 Award of Contract for Fire Station No. 31 – Horizons Construction Company International, Inc.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Reallocate previously adopted appropriations for emergency operations center (EOC) in the amount of \$875,000 to cover the contingencies and revisit funding for EOC at a later date or concurrently with the new proposed City Hall/Civic Center;
- 2. Award a construction contract with Horizons Construction Company International, Inc. in an amount not-to-exceed \$4,220,000;
- 3. Approve a supplemental contingency fund for change orders in an amount not-to-exceed \$420,000;
- 4. Approve the payment of sewer and water facilities fees to Jurupa Community Services District in an amount not-to-exceed \$108,000;
- 5. Approve the increase to WLC Architecture and Engineering agreement by \$45,000 for a not-to-exceed total of \$480,000; and
- 6. Authorize the City Manager to execute all necessary documents.

City Engineer Alvarez and Project Manager Williamson summarized the staff report

Councilmembers discussed the item and staff answered related questions.

9.2 Selection of Consultant for Engineering Design Services for Traffic Signal at Sumner Avenue & 65th Street – ADVANTEC Consulting Engineers

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Approve the professional services agreement with ADVANTEC Consulting Engineers for Engineering Design Services for traffic signal design at Sumner Avenue & 65th Street in the amount of \$16,392.

City Engineer Alvarez summarized the staff report.
