Subject: Assembly Bill 341 – Mandatory Commercial and Multi-Family

Recycling Requirements

Dear Waste Management Customer:

This letter is to inform you about a new state recycling requirement that could affect your commercial or multi-family property. On October 6, 2011, the California Legislature passed Assembly Bill 341 (AB 341), which increases the State of California's waste diversion goal from 50 percent to 75 percent. This state legislation also includes mandatory commercial and multi-family recycling to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

All commercial accounts that generate (4) four yards or more of trash per week and multi-family accounts that have (5) five units or more are required by the State of California to establish and maintain recycling service. The City of Eastvale and Waste Management are working on the development of a modified rate structure that will ensure your account is in compliance with the new State mandate.
